Creating Culture in Thomas

Many towns in West Virginia experienced lightning-fast growth as they became part of a network of railroads. These towns usually had access to abundant resources like coal or timber that provided jobs for the town's residents. Many towns were built by companies—employees of coal companies would live in houses owned by the company they worked for. However, this was not always the case. One town that was built by residents instead of a coal company is Thomas, West Virginia.
